ROADRUNNER CAFÉ OPENS AT GCC

Deptford Twp – Through the combined efforts of the Gloucester County Special Services School District, Gloucester County College, the Gloucester County Office of Disability Services, and Wawa, college students have a new option for their morning coffee, a quick lunch, or dinner on the run. The Roadrunner Café at GCC is now open for business.

The busy Café is staffed by two adult supervisors and seven young adults referred for employment by the Gloucester County Office of Disability Services and graduates of the Bankbridge Career Center. Located adjacent to the cafeteria in the College Center, the Roadrunner Café is open Monday through Friday from 7:30 a.m. to 2 p.m. With Corporate assistance, the Café was shaped on a Wawa model like those existing at GCIT and Bankbridge Regional School.

Freeholder Director Stephen M. Sweeney said, “The Roadrunner Café offers viable employment opportunities for the young adults in this program and at the same time provides a much needed service to the College’s expanding student population.”

Freeholder Joseph A. Brigandi Jr., noted, “This is another excellent example of our County entities working together with a local corporation to ensure the greatest benefit at the least possible expense. Wawa’s generous donation permits our students to receive job-related training and protocols and the valuable experience of interacting with customers.” Brigandi is the liaison to the Gloucester County Office of Disability Services.

“We welcome the Roadrunner Café as a positive addition to the campus. It offers more options to our growing number of GCC students and provides the opportunity for

the young adults employed by the Café to gain self-confidence and independence,” said GCC President Russell A. Davis.

Gloucester County College’s 250-acre campus is located on Tanyard Road in Deptford, just off Exit 56 of Route 55.
