### BOOTH RADIOLOGY TRAINING GRANT PROMOTES BUSINESS PROFICIENCY

Deptford Twp. – Employees at Booth Radiology in Woodbury will have the opportunity to gain exposure to customized training and professional development courses at Gloucester County College’s Business and Industry Training (BIT) Center thanks to a \$9,200 New Jersey Department of Labor & Workforce Development grant that will enhance the computer skills of staff members. The training grant, awarded November 2009, will provide instruction in Microsoft Word 2007, Excel, PowerPoint and business writing.

“For more than 60 years, Booth Radiology has been a good neighbor providing medical technology to help keep people healthy as well as employment opportunities,” said Freeholder Director Stephen M. Sweeney. “Customized training available through Gloucester County College’s BIT Center, and grants like this from the Department of Labor & Workforce Development, make it possible to accommodate employer needs.”

Since 1948, Booth Radiology has provided superior outpatient radiology and diagnostic imaging services in Gloucester County. All Booth radiologists are fellowship trained and board certified by the American Board of Radiology. At Booth, technology has the leading edge with 3 Tesla and 1.5 Tesla MRI open scanners, 64-slice high resolution CT scanners, digital mammography, PET/CT, echocardiography, nuclear medicine, ultrasound and digital radiology. In August 2009, Booth was designated a Breast Imaging Center of Excellence by the American College of Radiology (ACR). In addition, Booth is accredited by the ACR for PET, CT, MRI, mammography and ultrasound and accredited by the Intersocietal Commission for the Accreditation of Echocardiography Laboratories (ICAEL) ensuring high-quality echocardiographic

diagnostic evaluations. Booth is dedicated to maintaining both high medical and customer service standards.

“This grant with Booth Radiology is a fine example of GCC’s expanding commitment to support the businesses and workforce living in Gloucester County through a full range of educational opportunities,” said Gloucester County College President Russell A. Davis.
